1 Introduction

Goa Institute of Rural Development & Administration (GIRDA) was established by converting the former Extension Training Centre (ETC) into a full- fledged *State Institute of Rural Development* vide order No. Gen 1/1-1/GIRDA dated 5th November, 1999. GIRDA was expanded and converted to **Goa Institute of Public Administration & Rural Development (GIPARD)** on 01st January, 2014. It has been declared as the Administrative Training Institute (ATI) and it also functions as the State Institute for Rural Development and Panchayati Raj (SIRD&PR).

This Institute caters to the training needs of Government Official as well as non officials such as Elected Representatives of Local Self-Government bodies, Self Help Groups (SHGs), Academic Institutions, NGOs, etc.

Vision:

To be among the top five training institutions in the Country in Rural Development, Panchayati Raj and Public Administration, financially self-sustaining, with capacities and infrastructure for training, research, publication and consultancy in the areas of Development Administration studies, Public Policy and Governance, through collaborative initiatives with national, international and inter-governmental Institutions.

Objectives of the Institute

GIPARD is a composite training Institute having a dual role as an Administrative Training Institute (ATI) and as the State Institute of Rural Development & Panchayati Raj (SIRD&PR). The Objectives of GIPARD are as follows: -

- To achieve excellence in decentralized governance and development administration training.
- To impart training to Government Officials and non-officials, functionaries directly or indirectly involved in the process of administration and rural development and to be responsive to the needs of the citizens.
- To create an awareness of the potentialities of modern management service as a major instrument for rural development and better administrative services and practices.
- To update knowledge of the Government Officers/employees on latest technologies and processes of good governance.
- To promote better understanding of professional requirements including the need for value-based management.

- To develop effective methods, so as to change the attitude of the Government employees towards efficient service delivery.
- To organize and conduct special training courses, symposia, workshops, seminars, departmental examinations, etc.
- To undertake various other activities like consultancy, model pilot projects, research - both operational and policy related, etc.
- To undertake systematic policy-oriented research so as to assist and support the Government in evolving more effective and evidence-based policies, programmes and public sector management systems in Goa.
- To serve as the policy making body to work out, test, validate and implement training strategies for all employees of Government of Goa including those at administrative and managerial level.

5. Programmes and Activities conducted during the financial year 2020-2021

Programmes conducted from April 2020 to March 2021

This Institute has completed the following activities related to capacity building and other training & research activity during the year 2020-21:

A. Training and Capacity Building:

(i) Training Programmes:

GIPARD has conducted training programmes for officials of the State Government, functionaries of Rural Development and Panchayati Raj, Elected Representatives, Academicians, Self Help Groups, etc.

GIPARD has managed to conduct 170 programmes covering 6464 participants, considering the fact that the COVID-19 pandemic and its associated lockdown / curfew related restrictions were an impediment to arrange for face-to-face programmes on the field and off the field. Off-Campus programmes were severely restricted and GIPARD initiated the use of ICT based training schemes to connect the trainees / clientele group using *on-line* mode of communication.

The duration of these training programmes ranged from a day to a maximum of 15 days.

The major training programmes, conducted during this year include:

- a. Basic Training Programme under NRLM.
- b. ToT Programme on Micro Credit Plan (MCP) under NRLM.
- c. Training Programmes on "Service Matters".
- d. Programme on the Right to Information Act, 2005 for Heads of Departments.
- e. Workshop on Planning Process at Village Level in Beacon/Model Panchayats.
- f. Training Programme on Participatory Planning for Preparation of GPDP.
- g. Programmes sponsored by the DoPT, Govt. of India.
- h. Demand based programmes for Government Departments.
- i. Online Training programme on COVID-19.
- j. Training programmes on "Atmanirbhar Bharat, Swayampurna Goa".

(ii) **Demand based courses:** GIPARD conducted Demand based courses for the O/o Inspector General of Prisons, Collectorate of North Goa & Department of Planning, Statistics and Evaluation.

(iii) Special Programmes:

a. "Atmanirbhar Bharat, Swayampurna Goa":

GIPARD conducted training sessions for Colleges, Village Panchayats and the 'Swayampurna Mitras' under the "Atmanirbhar Bharat, Swayampurna Goa" project.

b. Training Programme for Zilla Panchayat Members:

A Foundation training programme for newly elected Zilla Panchayat Members was conducted from 12th to 15th January 2021. The programme was attended by 45 participants.

The training provided information on the role and functions of the ZP and the salient provisions of the XV Finance Commission Recommendations for Rural Bodies, besides the schemes of Central and State Governments.

c. Right to Information Act, 2005 programmes:

Training programme on the Right to Information Act, 2005 for Heads of Departments and Officers of Goa Civil Service was held on 12th March 2021. 30 HoD's and Goa Civil Service Officers participated in this session. This was a special session held apart from other RTI programmes carried out during the year

B. Research Activities:

a. Action Research on Model Village under “Integrated Development of Four Village Panchayats in Goa through Convergence of Government Schemes”.

The action research is was carried out in four Village Panchayats of Ozarim, Latambarcem, Barcem & Gaondongrim. This Research was funded by DRDA. The objective of this research was to develop these four villages as models through convergence wherein the need, requirement of the villages was identified and plan of action was prepared to provide the needed support with the help of different schemes and programmes implemented by various departments. Action Research was carried out by this Institute with the help of The Energy Resource Institute (TERI), Goa Livelihood Forum (GLF), Konkani Development Society and Mineral Foundation of Goa. Regular feedback was obtained from these agencies on the progress made and corrective action was taken. The final report will be submitted to DRDA during the year 2021-22, as the project is in the final stage of completion during this year.

b. A study on the Economic Revival Plan for Village Panchayats (April to September, 2020):

(i) *Brief Description:*

GIPARD along with the Directorate of Higher Education took up a detailed study on the Economic Revival Plan for Village Panchayats. The reports, were prepared (*based on the data collected from 191 VP's by the 25 colleges under DHE*) by GIPARD and Directorate of Higher Education, which was submitted to the Government of Goa. A detailed strategy and Action Plan was prepared to implement this Economic Revival of VPs and was formally handed over to the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Goa on 14.08.2020. This plan led to the launch of the Hon'ble Chief Minister's flagship programme, “*Atmanirbhar Bharat, Swayampurna Goa*”

(ii) *Background:*

The lockdown induced by the COVID-19 pandemic, brought to fore several challenges and disrupted the day to day activity of the population at large. The wheels of the Goan economy, heavily dependent on the service and tourism sector came to a grinding halt. The fiscal challenges before the State Government brought out some innovative strategies; one being, to explore the strengths of the key drivers behind the presently stagnant rural economy and take measures to revive it in a mission mode action plan.

A study was envisaged by the State Executive Committee (SEC) on 13th April, 2020; through *Colleges* under **Directorate of Higher Education (DHE) supported by the State's Apex Training Institute, namely, Goa Institute of Public Administration and Rural Development (GIPARD).**

(iii) Study Plan & Timelines:

25 Colleges covered 191 Village Panchayats, with faculty teams covering all the VPs (with all stakeholders: Elected Representatives, women, youth groups, Senior Citizens, traditional artisans and livelihood, professionals, MSME's, etc.); over the months of May and June '2020.

The objectives of the study was to:—

1. Study the socio-economic, Institutions, resources, livelihood aspects of the Village Panchayats.
2. Analyse the potential for revival of sectors related to agriculture, animal husbandry, fishery, horticulture, tourism, MSME, traditional means of livelihood etc.
3. Study the possibilities of Institutional Strengthening at the village level.
4. Analyze the scope of enhancing revenue for the Panchayats.

Thereafter, a **Core Team and Assisting Team was formed by DHE & GIPARD**; comprising of **05 faculties from Colleges, 03 faculties from GIPARD and 02 Officers from DHE**; went minutely through all the individual VP reports as prepared by the Colleges who carried out the study and a ***draft initial report covering the common findings of all the Reports, collated block wise, was presented to the Hon'ble Chief Minister on 14th August, 2020.***; by GIPARD & (DHE)

(iv) Project Report & Action Plan

The focus centered on making the Village Panchayat (VP) a self-reliant entity by empowering the VP as an Institution, as also its community with an aim of socio-economic upliftment of each sectoral stakeholder. The focus was on the *prime objective: "Swaympurna Gaon, Sampanna Goem"*.

Hon'ble Chief Minister proposed implementation of this plan during his Independence Day address to the people of Goa on 15th August, 2020.

On 18th September, 2020, GIPARD and DHE presented *the Action Plan and Strategy for implementing the Report*, based on Sectoral Analysis, to the Hon'ble Chief Minister.

The Action Plan Strategy involved a three stage approach with attainable goals covering *short term (over one year), intermediate term (one year to three years) and long term (more than three years)*.

The Sectoral approach identified these areas of implementation of measures:

- *Agriculture*
- *Animal Husbandry*
- *Youth and Adolescents*
- *Senior Citizens*
- *Women and SHGs*
- *Tourism*
- *Fisheries*
- *Natural Resources*
- *Schemes and their Convergence*
- *General – Good Governance*

Taking cue from **Hon'ble Prime Minister's** mission of "***Atmanirbhar Bharat***", and as convergence of this plan strategy, Government of Goa launched this unique initiative in each of the Village Panchayats with the objective of reviving the overall rural economy while

strengthening the inter-departmental scheme implementation, convergence and Institutional mechanism at the local body level.

(v) Approvals & Launch

The Plan for **“ATMANIRBHAR BHARAT, SWAYAMPURNA GOA”** was **presented before the State Cabinet on 23rd September, 2020**; by GIPARD and DHE under the guidance of Chief Secretary (who is also the Chairman, GIPARD)/ Secretary to Cabinet.

Hon’ble Chief Minister also presented this Idea and Action Plan during his interaction with Hon’ble Prime Minister in New Delhi on 30th September, 2020; and the programme was **launched on the eve of Gandhi Jayanti being 01st October, 2020**.

D. Certificate Courses:

i) Certificate Course on Community Engagement and Rural Development:

This Institute conducted a Certificate Course on Community Engagement and Rural Development, jointly with the Department of Political Science, Goa University. GIPARD conducted the practical component of this course. Two batches of these courses have been completed.

This Institute has conducted a course on Community Engagement and Rural Development for the Second Year for Post Graduate students' alongwith Goa University.

ii) Certificate Course on 'Decentralised Governance :GIPARD has obtained a No Objection Certificate from the Directorate of Higher Education to run a special course on "*Decentralized Governance*". The process of affiliation for the said course from Goa University is underway and will be presented to the Goa University Affiliation Committee during the year 2021-22.

E. Other Activities:

MOU signed with the State Institute of Health and Family Welfare, Dte. of Health Services:

The Institute has signed a Memorandum of Understanding with the State Institute of Health & Family Welfare, situated at Old Asilo Hospital, Mapusa and has begun conducting trainings on administrative functioning and financial matters for the employees of the Directorate of Health Services.

F. Infrastructure Facilities :

1. Major repair, renovation, refurbishing and retrofitting (including structural) work of existing building.

The major repair, renovation, refurbishing and retrofitting (including structural) work , to the existing GIPARD building (nearly five decade old) was carried out during the year. A new classroom-cum-hall with a seating capacity of 75 participants and a pantry catering to 50 persons has been provided. Civil works for the new hall & pantry with granite fittings and platform, new window panels and fittings have been under taken on the second floor, with a new roof (on metal structure framework).

The entire building has been plastered and painted, as there were extensive damages due to heavy rainfall (July to September, 2020), due to which there were damages to the Classrooms and Computer Lab on the 1st floor. Also, provisions of additional toilets for trainees (especially women) have been made on first floor and second floor.

The following fittings / fixtures have been installed for refurbishment of a new hall, classrooms and staff rooms:

- a. Curtains for the new hall, sound system (PA) & training aids (white board, projections stands, partition screens, LED screens, multiuse lectern etc.).
- b. Tables and chairs for the classroom/hall.
- c. Tables and chairs for the dining hall / cafeteria (pantry).
- d. Pedestal fans for circulation of air.
- e. Electricals / Lighting fixtures and ceiling fans including UPS/inverter systems for continuous power supply.
- f. Wooden partitions / Air conditioners / Furniture for the classroom, staff rooms, library, reception and Officer / faculty rooms.
- g. Fittings / fixtures / partitions for the new and old toilets / washrooms.

2. Training equipments have been installed in classrooms such as media board and interactive projectors with LED screens.

3. Based on Fire Audit recommendation a new battery room (3 x 2 sq. m.) adjacent to the existing building has been constructed to house the UPS and Inverter Batteries. So also, the old building has been given RCC based plinth protection and a mini-pantry has been created on the ground floor. All the toilets, have been refurbished and provided with new sanitary fittings

4. New building construction for GIPARD.

The process for constructing a new building for GIPARD, in Ella Farm has been initiated. The change of zone has been approved by the Government in the TCP Department.

The proposed new building of GIPARD, in Ella Farm will consist of the following facilities:

- i. Classrooms
- ii. Auditorium
- iii. Staff rooms
- iv. Laboratory / Library
- v. Dining Area
- vi. Open Spaces / work spaces
- vii. Training Halls

The design for the building along with costing has been worked at an estimated amount of Rs. 08.75 crores. The presentation of the plans was done by the award winning Architects (*M/s Shivastu*) for this project, in which the land use plan, layout of the new building, floor wise construction plan was presented before the Honorable Chief Minister Dr. Pr amod Sawant on the occasion of laying of the foundation stone for the new GIPARD building which was held at his hands on 31/12/2020.

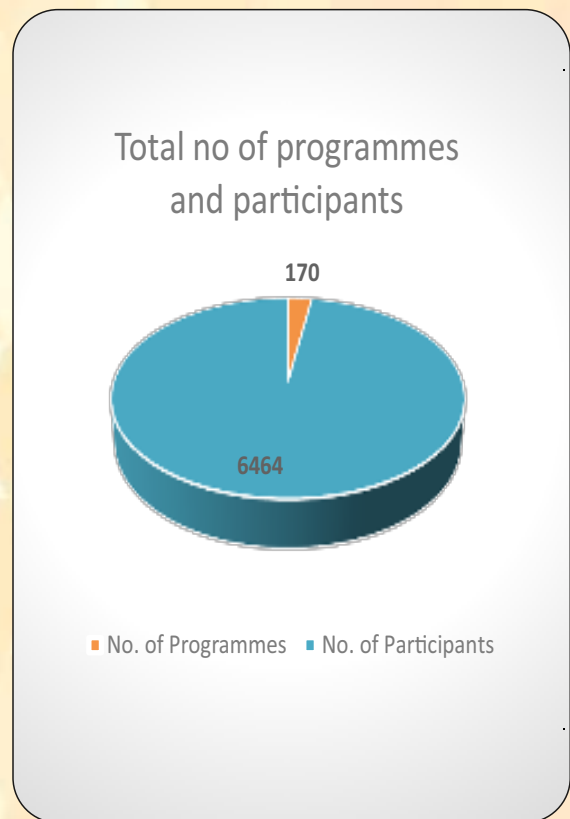
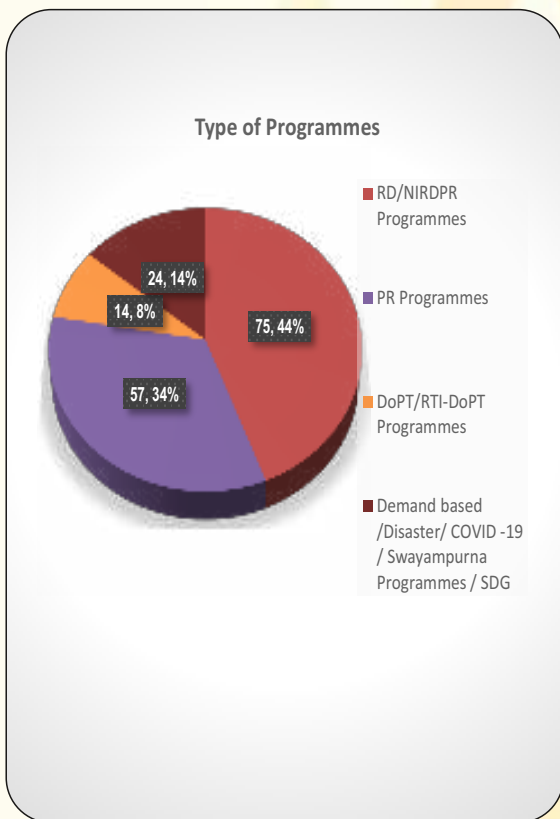

REPORT ON THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Goa Institute of Public Administration and Rural Development (GIPARD) which comprise the Balance Sheet as at 31st March 2021, and the Income and Expenditure Account and Receipt and Payment Account for the year then ended and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

MANAGEMENT IS RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The management of GIPARD is responsible for the matters with respect to the preparation and presentation of these financial statements that give a true and fair view of the financial position and financial performance of GIPARD in accordance with the accounting principles generally accepted in India. 1. There are substantial grants which have remained unutilized for more than a year as referred to Note 2A subject to verification.
2. There was reportedly one meeting of executive committee during the financial year ended 31st March 2021. The numbers of meetings were not as per the provisions of GIPARD Rules which require at least one meeting in every three months. There was only one meeting of Board of Governors during the financial year ended 31st March 2021.

In arriving our opinion, we reported that:

- a) We have sought and obtained all the information and explanations which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit.
- b) In our opinion, proper books of accounts are required by the law have been kept by the society so far as it appears from our examination of those books.
- c) The Balance Sheet and the Statement of Profit & Loss and Receipt and Payment Account dealt with by the Report are in agreement with the books of accounts.
- d) In our opinion, the aforesaid financial statements comply with the applicable Accounting Standards.

Significant Accounting Policies & Notes to Accounts

a) Significant Accounting Policies

1. Basis of preparation of accounts

- Accounts are prepared on historical cost convention and under accrual basis of accounting unless otherwise stated.
- The accounting policies, not specifically referred to are consistent with generally accepted accounting principles.

2. Grants/ Subsidies

- Grants and Subsidies are accounted when expenditure there against is incurred and realization is certain.
- Government grant related to revenue is recognized on a systematic basis in the Income & Expenditure statement over the period necessary to match them with the related costs which are intended to compensate.
- Government grants related to depreciable fixed assets are treated as deferred income which is recognized in the Income & Expenditure statement on a systematic and rational basis over the useful life of the assets, i.e., such grants are allocated to income over the period and in proportion in which depreciation on those assets is charged.

3. Revenue Recognition

- Revenue is recognized in accordance with AS9 issued by ICAI
- Revenue from Govt. grants is recognized in accordance with AS 12.
- Interest on investments is recognized on accrual basis.

4. Retirement benefits to employees

- Gratuity: The society provides for gratuity, a defined benefit retirement plan ('the Gratuity Plan') covering eligible employees. The society fully contributes all ascertained liabilities to the GIRDA Employees' Gratuity Fund Trust ('the Trust'). Trustees administer contributions made to the Trust and contributions are invested in a scheme with Life Insurance Corporation of India, as permitted by law of India.
- Provident fund: Eligible employees receive benefits from a provident fund, which is a deferred benefit plan. Both the employee and the society make monthly contributions to the provident fund scheme employees Provident Fund Organization, Goa equal to a specified percentage of the covered employee's salary.

5. Investments

- Investments are carried at cost.

6. Inventories

- Closing stock of stationary is valued at lower of cost or net realizable value. Cost is determined after applying FIFO method.

7. Fixed Assets

- Fixed assets are valued at historical cost less depreciation.
- No deduction has been made from the gross value of the fixed assets against any government grant received.

8. Depreciation

- Depreciation is provided as per the rates specified under the Income Tax Act 1961.

b) Notes to Accounts

1. Printing and Stationary expenditure is apportioned based on Expenditure against Grants.
2. Balances of Sundry Creditors, Sundry Debtors and Unutilized Grants are subject to confirmation & reconciliation, if any.

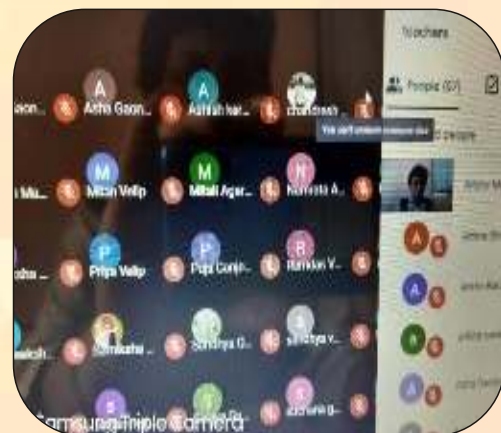
